Dear Lay Carmelites,

As we prepare for the upcoming Eucharistic Congress June 10th in Mankato, Minnesota. ¹ Let us meditate on the gift that is our Carmelite Sister, Saint Mary Magdalen de Pazzi. May 25th is the feast day of St. Mary Magdalene de Pazzi, the 16th century Carmelite mystic from Italy.

Baptized Caterina, and affectionately known as "The Passion Flower of the Eucharist" ² Saint Mary Magdalene was taught mental prayer at the tender age of nine at the request of her mother. By age ten she received her First Holy Communion and began experiencing mystical ecstasies.

Saint Mary Magdalene's first ecstasy happened at the sight of a beautiful sunset. She was so struck by the beauty of Go d's



creation that she trembled and became speechless.³

She eventually entered a Carmelite monastery. Her great love and devotion to the Eucharist is what led her to enter the Carmel of St. Mary's of the Angels, who had a special dispensation to daily receive Communion, which was almost unheard of at the time. In her first ecstatic experience after entering, her sisters found her weeping before a crucifix and crying out, "O Love, you are neither known nor loved." She experienced within her soul the pain that her Beloved Jesus experiences from the rejection of so many souls on the earth.

We savour [sic] most fully when we receive the holy Sacrament of your Body and Blood, for there more than anywhere else this sweetness and grace are found hidden, when the Sacrament is really received with purity and honesty. Let whoever wishes to taste of your gentleness and sweetness approach this Blood and there he will find all rest and consolation. The soul will be washed with this Blood, cleansed in this Blood, nourished by this Blood" -The Complete Works of St Mary Magdalene de Pazzi" vol 3
